#### 4.2 Programme requirements:

The minimum requirements for the degree are a total of 180 ECTS.

BA 1 - The first year of the programme integrates theoretical and practical themes and subjects. Some of the practical themes in BA 1 are compulsory, like the two weeks practice period.

BA 2 - The programme is divided into four 15 ECTS pieces. Half of the course is based on pedagogy and practice in school, while winter and spring semester is based on traditional outdoor life in Norway (skiing, glacier-climbing, knowledge about avalanche, paddling).

BA 3 - Outdoor Activities Intermediate Level

1-year program: 60 ECTS credits based on two compulsory courses: - scientific theory and methods, statistics, project work (15 ECTS) and excursions to mountains, glaciers, and climbing-excursion to France, guiding (15 ECTS) - Optional courses (15 ECTS)

Grades for undergraduate and postgraduate examinations are awarded according to a graded scale from A (highest) to F (lowest), with E as the minimum pass grade. A pass/fail mark is given for some examinations.

A - Excellent - An excellent performance, clearly outstanding. The candidate demonstrates excellent judgement and a high degree of independent thinking.

B - Very good - A very good performance. The candidate demonstrates sound judgement and a very good degree of independent thinking.

C - Good - A good performance in most areas. The candidate demonstrates a reasonable degree of judgement and independent thinking in the most important areas.

D - Satisfactory - A satisfactory performance, but with significant shortcomings. The candidate demonstrates a limited degree of judgement and independent thinking.

E - Sufficient - A performance that meets the minimum criteria, but no more. The candidate demonstrates a very limited degree of judgement and independent thinking.

F - Fail - A performance that does not meet the minimum academic criteria. The candidate demonstrates an absence of both judgement and independent thinking.

The grading scale for examinations taken before 01.09.2002 ranges from 1.0 to 6.0 with 1.0 being the best passing mark and 4.0 the lowest.




